- If you or your child need a quiet place to be during worship, you are welcome to use the room behind the sound board. In the quiet room you can an hear and see the worship service, there is comfortable seating, a diaper changing station, and toys for small children.
- This worship service is livestreamed on both Facebook and YouTube. If you prefer not to be shown on camera, you are invited to sit in the last four rows on the main floor, or in the balcony. During communion backs are visible.

CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

CONFESSION & FORGIVENESS

Beloveds,

Life can feel like it's out of control, out of reach, and that we're out of time.

Fortunately for us, God's grace is not.

No matter what we are able to hold, God is able to hold onto us.

So trusting that God's grace does not let us go, join me in the prayer of confession:

Gracious God,

You paint pictures of what could be, but we think those visions are impossible.
You speak of the lion lying down with the lamb, but we give in to skepticism and uncertainty.
You dream of a more just day, but we believe we are helpless.
Forgive us for losing sight of hope.
Forgive us for assuming that what we see is all there is.
Open up our hearts to see the world as you see it.
Open up our hearts to risk hope, to dream dreams, and to not be afraid of either.

No matter what you hold onto, and no matter what you let slip through your hands, God is holding onto you.

So hear and believe the good news of the Gospel:

THE READINGS

First Reading: Matthew 1:18-25 (First Nations Version)

¹⁸Here is the story of how the Chosen One was born:

His mother, Bitter Tears (Mary), had been promised in marriage to He Gives Sons (Joseph). But before they came together in marriage, while still a virgin, she found out that she was carrying a baby in her womb from the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹He Gives Sons (Joseph) was a man of honor. He did not want to bring her trouble and open shame, so he thought about secretly releasing her from the marriage promise. ²⁰As he wondered about these things, a messenger from the Great Spirit appeared to him in a dream and said, "He Gives Sons (Joseph), descendant of Much Loved One (David), do not be afraid to take Bitter Tears (Mary) to be your wife, because the Holy Spirit has given her this child. ²¹She will give birth to a son. You will name him Creator Sets Free (Jesus), because he will set his people free from their bad hearts and broken ways."

²²This gave full meaning to the words of Creator spoken long ago by the prophet, ²³"A young virgin will be with child and give birth to a son. They will call his name Immanuel, a which *in our tribal language* means Creator Is with Us."

²⁴When He Gives Sons (Joseph) woke up, he followed the guidance given him in the dream and took Bitter Tears (Mary) to be his wife. ²⁵But he did not have sexual relations with her until after the child was born, and he named the child Creator Sets Free (Jesus).

⁴⁶⁻⁴⁷"From deep in my heart I dance with joy to honor the Great Spirit. ⁴⁸Even though I am small and weak, I have been noticed. Now I will be looked up to by all. ⁴⁹The Mighty One has lifted me up! His name is sacred. He is the Great and Holy One."

⁵⁰"He shows kindness and pity to both children and elders who respect him.

⁵¹His strong arm has brought low the ones who think they are better than others. ⁵²He counts coup* with arrogant warrior chiefs but puts a headdress of honor on the ones with humble hearts." ⁵³"He prepares a great feast for the ones who are hungry, but sends the overstuffed ones home with empty bellies. ⁵⁴⁻⁵⁵ He has been kind to the tribes of Wrestles with Creator (Israel) who walk in his ways, for he has remembered the ancient promises he made to our ancestors-to Father of Many Nations (Abraham) and his descendants."

When she finished, they both laughed with joy. With hearts full of gladness they told each other their stories.

*1:52 "Counting coup" was a Native American practice among some of the Plains tribes of touching an enemy with a coup stick as an act of courage during battle, to show he could have killed him but chose to spare him instead. Each time the coup stick was used in battle, a mark would be placed on it. It counted the number of victories one.
